Double Quarter-final Heartbreak for Hockey Superstars

On Thursday last week we took two eager teams of Year 5 & 6 pupils to the annual Marjon Hockey tournament. We had no fewer than 45 children who tried out to make the teams and our task of picking the teams was made very difficult, as the standard of play was so high!

Our teams were picked, and we headed off with a mixture of excitement and nerves. Both teams played superbly throughout the tournament and picked up some notable scalps in the group stages, with the B team surprising, me, Lee and themselves by beating the Drake A team in their first game. Our opponents team contained four members of the same team that had knocked our A team out of the competition last year on their way to winning the Shield. Our B team of; Kamora, Seren, Hazel, Abbie C, Alice, Shea, Hayden, Archie, Tom R and Daniel played doggedly to win that game 2-0 with both goals coming from Hayden. The B team went on to win two more of their morning games and were also beaten on two occasions, finishing a credible 3rd in their group and progressing to the 1st round of the Shield competition in the afternoon.

In the B team's first-round game we came from a goal down to beat Mary Deans A team 2-1 with the winning goal from Hayden coming in the last 5 seconds of the game, following some determined play from Shea and Alice. After a mass pitch-invasion from our A team, Hayden was carried off the pitch shoulder high! In the quarter finals we took the lead against Horrabridge B only to let them equalise and then lose to a very dubious goal in the latter stages of their game. Hayden finished the competition with 7 goals, Shea with 1 and Archie scored the goal of the day, rounding off a superb team move involving 5 members of the team.

The A team consisting of Johan, Harry, Owen, Jamie, Sarel, Ruby, Isa, Lottie and Abbie D played a total of 8 games in a frantic morning session, winning 6 and drawing 2 – in fact they only conceded 1 goal all morning and finished 2nd in their group, progressing to the Cup competition in the afternoon. Highlights of the morning session were successive 6-0 wins over St Neot and Horrabridge C with 7 different players scoring goals in what was a fantastic team performance.

In the A team's first-round game we drew Plymouth College Prep (a team who hadn't lost a game or conceded a goal in their group games earlier in the day). We played superbly with player after player putting in last-ditch block tackles and literally putting their bodies on the line at times to keep us in the game. After some great work from Ruby and Owen, Harry opened the scoring with a cool finish and then fed Owen to double our lead. Isa, Lottie and Johan played energetically in the heat to maintain our clean sheet and we held on to win 2-0. Our quarter-final opponents were South Brent (a team consisting of some real giants!). In truth, I think we'd run ourselves into the ground in the previous 9 games and, despite Jamie, Abbie and Sarel adding some much-needed energy from the bench, we just ran out of steam and lost by a single goal. There was never any doubting our commitment throughout and this was epitomised when Isa bravely dived into a tackle for the umpteenth time and caught a very painful whack on her hand! Our journey was over... but we'd had a fabulous day and we should all be very proud of both our achievements and the way we conducted ourselves throughout the day. Huge thanks go to Lee who accompanied me and also to Mrs Rickard, Mrs Hall and Mrs Fox who helped with transport (and medical second opinions!).
